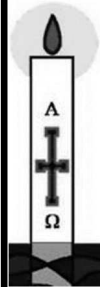

PASCAL CANDLE FACTS

- * The word "paschal" is the equivalent of the Hebrew *pesah*, meaning *the passing over*, which means the feast of Passover.
- * With Christianity the word "paschal" took on a new meaning, referring to Our Lord's passion, death, resurrection, and glorification.
- * There is clear evidence that this solemn rite began no later than the second half of the fourth century
- * From around the 12th century the custom began of inscribing the current year on the candle as well as the dates of the principal movable feasts.
- * Each year during the Easter Vigil service on Holy Saturday night, a fire is kindled in a metal bowl, called a brazier. From the brazier comes a "new" and blessed fire that lights the Paschal candle which is carried in procession into the dark church.
- * The "new" fire serves as an image of the Resurrection. The candle, which represents Christ himself, is placed on a special Paschal candle stand near the altar.
- * The candle itself should be made of at least 51% real beeswax, and generally measures 3-5 feet tall and 4-10 lbs.
- * Five grains of incense representing Christ's wounds are inserted into the candle in the form of a cross.
- * An "alpha" above the cross and an "omega" below (the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet) indicate that Christ is the beginning and end of all.
- * The candle remains in the sanctuary during the 50 days of Easter season and is lit for all liturgical offices. After Pentecost it is left next to the baptismal font.
- * During the year it is lit during all baptisms.
- * The candle is placed next to the casket during the funeral Mass. In this way it symbolizes baptism as a death and resurrection in Christ, and also testifies to Christian certainty in the resurrection of the dead as well as to the fact that all are alive in the risen Christ.

HOLY WEEK AND THE TRIDUUM

Even though the liturgical year begins chronologically at Advent, it reaches its culmination during the Easter Triduum, particularly at Easter, the "solemnity of solemnities," the "Great Feast."

The word Triduum comes from the Latin word meaning "three days." It begins the evening of Holy (Maundy) Thursday and ends at Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Thus, the Triduum consists of three full 24-hour days which begin and end in the evening. The Triduum technically is not part of Lent (at least in the modern Catholic liturgical reckoning), but Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are still reckoned as part of the traditional forty day Lenten fast.

The Triduum celebrates the heart of Christian faith, salvation, and redemption: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Thus, the Triduum commemorates the Institution of the Eucharist (the "sacrament of sacraments"), the institution of the priesthood, the passion, crucifixion, death of the Lord, his descent to the dead, and finally his glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday. Along with the Ascension, these important events make up the Paschal Mystery.

The purpose of Holy Week is to reenact, relive, and participate in the passion of Jesus Christ. This is accomplished by the following Liturgies in the week leading up to Easter:

- Palm Sunday (or Passion Sunday), the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem.
- Holy (or Maundy) Thursday the institution of the Holy Eucharist and priesthood.
- Good Friday, the arrest, trial, crucifixion, death, and burial of Jesus Christ.
- Holy Saturday, the Sabbath on which Jesus rested in the grave.

Chrism Mass

The Chrism Mass is one of the most joyful and intense liturgies of the year. The faith and vitality of the diocesan Church is felt as so many laity and religious fill the cathedral to pray for our priests as they renew their priestly promises at the Chrism Mass.

The renewal of priestly promises, the blessing of the new oils and the consecration of new chrism remind us of the perennial "newness" of the Gospel, of our faith and of the ministerial priesthood.

Of course, we remember the past; and we remember the paschal mystery. We remember with thanksgiving, yet in remembering, we experience new joy and hope that brings new fruitfulness to our ministry.
