We will be keeping the Grade School for our own use and the vacant land will go back on the market for sale.

The committee strongly suggested that a Capital Campaign be started before year end to raise money for future renovation of buildings and new buildings necessary for the needs of our Parish.

The Financial Advisory Council will be starting a five-year Capital Campaign for \$4.5 million by October 1, 2017.

A new Building Committee will be formed in mid-September which will consist of the FAC, PAC and members from the Parish. This committee will advise Fr.
