Launching out into the deep

While Prophet Elijah encountered God in a gentle breeze, Peter, the chief of the Apostles encounters God strolling on a stormy sea. The circumstances of the two encounters seem diametrically opposed to each other, and yet, in both cases, there is a call to enter into life's 'depth dimension'. The God-encounter is only possible when one dives deeper, climbs higher, ventures further and 'burns one's boats' to launch out into the deep. Where do we encounter God?

Peter's encounter with Jesus becomes model of the Church's encounter with God. Life tosses us about and makes us scream, "Help!". Rather than save us by shortcuts, Jesus appears in life's storms, saying, "Courage, it is I!". His invitation also follows: "Come!". Are we ready, as individuals and the Church, to jump off the boat, leave the bandwagon and abandon the mad crowd which always tempts us to choose the short-cuts or be evasive?

The storms that surround us are man-made and might seem too monstrous and heavy to battle against. The enormous psychological and mental stress that those storms bring about, leave us stranded and we feel so helpless just because we own them and try to gain mastery over them with our human skills. However, when we turn to God to pull us out of anything that haunts and stifles us, He is right there, to offer His helping hand. And He wants us to extend our helping hands to those around us when they are faced with troubles. The best role model in taking up this task is none other than our Blessed Mother whose Assumption into Heaven is that we celebrate this week. Happy Feast! May we also be taken (assumed) into Heaven!

Festivals and Seasons

The Church's liturgical year is an unbroken circle of fasts and festivals. Thus is the psalmist's prophecy fulfilled for us again and again: "You crown the year with your goodness" (Ps 64:11). At the beginning of the year, Christmas and Epiphany celebrate Christ's coming in the flesh. "Conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary," Jesus Christ enters fully into the weakness and poverty of our human condition. The Church, gathered from every nation on earth, rejoices in the radiance of his light.

Lent is a forty-day period of intense listening to the Word of God and of penance. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer prepare us to enter through the Cross of Christ into the joy of his resurrection.

The heart of the liturgical year pulsates in the Three Days that commemorate Christ's death, burial, and resurrection: Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. The Paschal Vigil in the night of Holy Saturday draws us together in the light of the Risen Christ to listen to the Word of God and to celebrate the communication of his life in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Easter, traditionally called Pascha in both East and West, is prolonged for fifty days; Pentecost marks the last day of Paschaltide and recalls the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in a mighty wind and tongues of fire (cf. Ac 2:2).

The Easter cycle is followed by a series of summer festivals: solemnities of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. With the end of summer the Church turns her prayer to the great harvest of the Kingdom where already the Virgin Mary assumed into heaven and all the saints intercede for us, pilgrims on earth. Throughout the year, feasts of the Virgin Mary and of the saints reflect the light of Christ and reflect his beauty. Finally, every December the Church returns to the Advent season, putting all her hope in the word of Christ who says, "Surely I am coming soon" (Rev 22:20).
