Weeding out ...

After enlightening and encouraging us to yield good and bountiful fruits, Jesus presents, through the parable of seeds and weeds, a warning to become aware of the corruptible weeds in and around us (the egoistic attitudes resulting in the evil habits) that can choke and strangle us to death. Unless we take sincere efforts to uproot and throw them away, there is every possibility of losing our sight on the ultimate goal - God's kingdom.

The parable has a focus on eschatology (the 'last things') when distinctions like good/bad, righteous/wicked and saint/sinner will be crystal clear. Much to the chagrin of the Pharisees, Jesus showed how the 'so-called sinners' were integral part of the kingdom on the earth and how this will be resolved in the consummation of the kingdom.

"Bloom where you are planted!" is the famous caption. But the most challenging one would be: "Survive where you're stuck!". In God's garden, life is often not a bed of roses, but a crown of thorns. Surviving, not blooming is common. 'Seeds of growth' breed 'weeds of decay', either if one does not labor or if circumstances go beyond one's control. While weeding out the worst in us, let's sow 'seeds of compassion' for others.

Preparing for Mass by Praying at Home

The joy of being Catholic is in the Eucharist. The Most Holy Eucharist, also called Holy Mass, is the wellspring of Catholic life and its summit. The Catholic is, at every moment, caught up in one of three movements. Either one is on the way to church, giving witness to the Kingdom by preparing for the Sacred Banquet; or one is in church, participating fully, consciously, and actually in the Sacred Liturgy; or one is sent forth out of church into the world to bear witness to “that which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life” (1 John 1:1). The Church lives from Eucharist to Eucharist, amazed by the wonder of so great a gift, and awaiting her “blessed hope” (Titus 2:13), the return of Christ in glory.

The Eucharistic life begins on the way to church. Go to church with a heart made ready for the Mystery. Begin at home by reading the texts appointed for the day’s Mass: first reading, responsorial psalm, second reading, and Gospel. The references for these texts are readily available in your parish bulletin, on your church calendar, or in your missal. Let the Word of God resonate in your heart; read the texts aloud, slowly, and with attention. Repeat the phrases that strike you. Let the Word itself become your prayer; send back to God the Word he has addressed to you. Then, for a few moments, remain in silence. Adore the God who has spoken to you. Ask Him to give you hunger for the “daily bread” (Luke 11:4) you will receive at Mass. Go to church with hunger and desire; you will not be sent away empty (cf. Luke 1:53). Faithful to his promise, God will fill you with good things (cf. Luke 1:53).

THE MEASURE OF SUCCESS

The Middle Ages looked to the saint as the measure of man, as what marked his possibilities. We, however, look to success in worldly endeavors as the mark of man, sometimes even suggesting that the one who does “great deeds” on earth will go on to do even greater things in heaven. What is the content of our hope for our children? How many of us deeply and consciously hope not for their success and freedom from want but rather that they become like St. Paul or St. Perpetua or St. Thomas More? Do we not rather hope for their success, leaving to them not a legacy of faith but rather enough money so they can be comfortable? And in the process almost ensure that they will never become saints.
