Ministry of reconciliation

The Church is Jesus' family where reconciliation must begin, and then spread out to all others. Jesus' promise about binding and losing appears twice in Matthew's gospel; first, to Peter, the leader and second, to all disciples. In sum, the ministry of reconciliation is not the prerogative only of the ordained ministers, but the responsibility of all Christians, as well. The three levels proposed by Jesus, namely private, public and official, to win the erring brother/sister are the clear indication to encourage us to settle the scores with others, especially when it becomes too hard for us to forgive them. No matter whether we take one or all the three levels, the bottom line is the call to reconcile. Remaining positive always, accepting others as God-sent-gifts to us, the ability to appreciate others, the humility in learning good things from others and looking for the common ground of agreement could be some of the ways to achieve success in this ministry.

Another aspect of reconciliation within the Church is also the denouncement of evil, for, in its presence, peace never prospers. By building the bridges in the process of reconciliation, we truly play a prophetic role. Failure of which calls for severe warning from God as being irresponsible and we would be held accountable for the offence. Our prophetic mission is very much challenged!

Reverence

“Eucharistic amazement” is expressed in reverence and in the dignity and care brought to every celebration of Mass. These are attitudes that befit not only the priest and other sacred ministers, but all the baptized. Through Baptism and Confirmation, God has prepared his children to stand in his presence and offer him worship. “Christian,” says Saint Leo the Great, “know your dignity” (Sermon I on the Birth of the Lord).

The first school of reverence is the home. Children can learn from their earliest years to make the sign of the cross slowly and deliberately, to kneel in adoration, to listen quietly, to stand in attention, and to treat holy things with respect. Adults can show by their example that the church is the house of God and the Mass the holiest of mysteries. In true reverence there is nothing constrained or artificial. Reverence is a joyful and gracious thing, akin to the wonder of one who finds himself face to face with a great beauty, or heart to heart with a great love. To every word and gesture of the Mass give the imprint of reverence. “I bow down before your holy temple,” says the psalmist, “filled with awe” (Psalm 5:8).
